Paving is a key operation in every Public Works Department. Whether you are doing your own paving or contracting it out, it is imperative that the job gets done right. This class focuses on best practices in pavement maintenance operations and inspection techniques. Instructors will provide details on getting the most out of every project, and participants will walk away with tips for ensuring that you get the best possible product.

This class is designed for those public works staff that have responsibility for inspecting and approving pavement project work. Construction Inspectors, Highway Foremen, Superintendents and Directors of Public Works are encouraged to attend.

Course Instructors

James Mahoney is the Associate Program Director of the Connecticut Transportation Institute and the Executive Program Director of the Connecticut Advanced Pavement Laboratory (CAP Lab) at the University of Connecticut. Jim has over 25 years experience in pavement materials research and design. He received his Master's degree from



research and design. He received his Master's degree from the University of Connecticut in 1995 and has been with the CAP Lab since that time.

Alex Bernier is the Program Director at the Connecticut Advanced Pavement Lab at the University of Connecticut. A former UConn student himself, before returning to the lab, Alex spent time as a consulting engineer for airports. He dealt with pavement design and construction at airports



across North America from Canada to the Caribbean including runway 13L-31R at JFK Airport. At the CAP Lab, Alex's work is focused on improving Statewide Pavement Management systems, pushing the envelope of project-level forensic analysis with Ground Penetrating RADAR, and pavement mixture performance testing.
