### Electrical Safety and Working with Utilities

A CT Road Master Program *ELECTIVE Workshop*

This workshop is an introduction to potential electrical and utility based hazards associated with roadway maintenance. It will focus on working around downed wires, utility poles and buried utilities.

Special attention will be paid to storm cleanup and emergency situations but routine procedures and protocols will also be discussed.

*Please note: These are socially distant sessions. All state and university COVID-19 precautions will be followed.*

### Who Should Attend

This program is designed for any public works professionals responsible for maintaining roads, responding to storm-related road emergencies and storm clean up. Foremen, Crew Leaders, Directors of Public Works and Highway Superintendents are also encouraged to attend.

### Course Instructors

**Warren Rogers** is a Certified Safety Professional with over 20 years of experience in teaching electrical safety. He was a safety officer for Eversource for 18 years and has been teaching for the T2 Center for more than a decade.

**Sean Morris** is a Public Utilities Engineer in the Gas Pipeline Safety Unit at the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority (CTDEEP). In that position, Sean provides education and outreach on the Call Before You Dig and gas pipeline safety programs.
